

CONDITIONS OF CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY

PACE OF PLAY POLICY – GUIDELINES FOR SLOW PLAY

OUT OF POSITION DEFINED - The first group to start will be considered out of position if, at any place during the round, the group in question exceeds the allotted time of play, as detailed on the hole location sheet.

Any subsequent group will be considered out of position if, at any time during a round, the group in question (a) exceeds the allotted time and (b) reaches a par-3 hole that is open and free of play or reaches a par-4 or par-5 hole and have not played a stroke from the teeing ground before the hole is open and free to play.

TIME MONITORING - An individual player is not subject to being timed unless the players' group is out of position as defined.

TIME PROCEDURE - Once a group is determined to be out of position, players in the group may be timed. Other than on the putting green, the timing of a player's stroke will begin when it is his turn to play and he can play without interference or distraction. Time spent determining yardages will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will begin after a player has been allowed a reasonable amount of time to mark, lift, clean and repair his ball mark and other ball marks on his line of putt and remove loose impediments on his line of putt.

NOTE: A player is permitted 40 seconds to play a stroke, and an extra 20 seconds (for a total of 60 seconds) will be allowed for:

- a. The first player to play a stroke on a par-3 hole
- b. The first player to play a second stroke on a par-3 or par-4 hole
- c. The first player to play a third stroke on a par-5 hole
- d. The first player to play a stroke around a putting green
- e. The first player to play a stroke on a putting green

Any player in a group being timed, who exceeds the applicable time to play a stroke, will be informed as soon as possible.

PENALTIES DURING A ROUND

First offence - One timing exceeding the applicable time to play a stroke – no penalty

Second Offence - One more timing (total of two) exceeding the applicable time to play a stroke - no penalty

Third Offence - One more timing (total of three) exceeding the applicable time to play a stroke - a one (1) - stroke penalty

Forth Offence - One more timing (total of four) exceeding the applicable time to play a stroke - an additional two (2)-stroke penalty

Fifth Offence - One more timing (total of five) exceeding the applicable time to play a stroke - disqualification

GENERAL - In administering the Pace of Play, the Rules Committee is acting to improve the general pace of play for all Club competitions. In performance of these duties, a Rules Official shall not be subjected to abuse, oral or otherwise. Such abuse is conduct unbecoming a Shaughnessy member.

APPEALS - Any appeal of a timing penalty or fine must be referred to the Director of Golf immediately upon completion of the player in question's round. The Director of Golf's decision will be final. If the player in question does not appeal immediately upon conclusion of his round, any penalties shall stand.
